• No color on color or metal on metal. • Try to keep it simple. Make it easy to paint, applique' or embroider.

Blazing a device

Blazon in layers from the deepest layer up to the surface:
Field (color or division & colors),
Primary charge (charge or ordinary),
Secondary charges close to the primary,
Tertiary charges on the primary or secondary,
Peripheral secondary charges (Chief, Canton, Border),
Tertiary charges on the peropheral.

Name field tinctures chief/dexter first. Only the first word, the metal Or, and proper nouns are capitalized.
