Warmer weather is finally here and so is the time for tourneys!! Tourneys, do we ever have tourneys!! Join us for our annual spring contest to choose the next Captain of the Winter's Gate militia and a rapier Commander of the Cavaliers. In addition, there will be a second rapier tourney for the honor of being Baroness' Champion. There will also be L'Emprise du Loup tournaments. So here's your chance to upgrade your kit, polish your armor, and look as shiny and authentic as possible.

As well as tourneys, there will be classes! Margery Garret will teach Viking whipcord braiding. Annora de Montfort will be journeying north to our fair lands, and has most graciously offered to teach a class on the history and uses of saffron, as well as a second class on how to do research and documentation. A Page School class on armor and the rules of warfare will be taught by a "knightly person."

Arts & Sciences contests are cordials and food with flowers. On Saturday there will be a picnic lunch auction to feed the baronial coffers. Contributors, please bring an enticing lunch for two. Hungry persons should bring money to bid upon the tasty lunches and the company of the gentles who prepared them. dinner is potluck: please bring a dish that will serve eight, accompanied by a written list of ingredients for the allergic among us.

To celebrate his recent Knighthood, Sir Varyag will hold a symbel Saturday evening. Lady Lilla aet Sceaphylie will be sitting vigil Saturday evening to prepare for her elevation into the Order of the Pelican and invites all who would come to share their wisdom with her.

A ribbon roses class will be taught by Ellisif a Reikiavik. If you're interested in learning how to make these traditional Oerthan roses, please bring the following supplies: 1.5" wide ribbon, floral wire, tape and and leaves, as well as needle and thread.

Please be reminded that this is bear country! All food and beverages not intended for immediate consumptions should be kept in hard-sided vehicles. No exceptions! For safety, please keep a clean camp and a close eye on children at all times.

There will be no food provided, so please plan accordingly. If you wish to participate, a potluck feast is planned for Saturday evening. The site is discreetly wet.

Our site rental includes use of the group camp area. If you wish to camp in an individual campsite there is a \$15/night rental fee. The site is the Eagle River Campground, Hesterberg Road, Eagle River. Site opens at noon Friday and closes at 6 pm Sunday. To get to the campground, take the Glenn Highway to the Hiland Road exit (Mile 12). Follow the signs to the campground and enter the gate for the group camp area.

House Odin's Hammer will post periodic Viking-oriented classes and workshops, to which all are invited (see below for the first).

House Odin's Hammer Invitation

Greetings Unto the Barony of Winter's Gate! House Odin's Hammer would like to extend an open invitation to the gentles in the Barony to attend a Viking Clothing work session at our home on June 2, from 10 am until . . . (well, you know how this works).

Viking Clothing Construction: we will assist with the cutting and construction of under tunics, underdresses, over tunics, apron dresses, pants and head coverings. This is open to all, and you can come when can during the day.

Bring the fabric you need to create your new ensembles. Traditional fabrics were linen, cottons and wools. Men: under and over tunics, 3 yards of fabric; pants, 3 yards of fabric. Ladies: underdresses, 3-5 yards depending on the width of the fabric and size of the body; head coverings, 1/2 yard of linen or cotton.

We will follow up this class on Sunday at fighter practice with a class on seam treatments and decorative stitching.

This is a hands-on learning opportunity: we will help you learn these new skills so you will be able to construct your own garments in the future. All patterns are going to be of a Viking flavor: we will not be able to assist clothing other barbarians at this time.

We will have the grill available for folks to cook meat and ask that you provide your own eat and a dish to share. We will provided koolaid, water, and tea.

And now for something entirely different:

Du'ad Bob Review

It sounded just too good to pass up. I mean, this particular flick had a lot of potential. The director, a well-known name who had done a number of period pieces very well in the past. The story, a well-known one from the pen of one of the greatest playwrights of all time, in any language. The music, also by a name that should be familiar. The leading man, one of the tops in his field. So, like I say, just a boatload of potential. So what is it I'm talking about? The director: Franco Zeffirelli (*Romeo and Juliet*, *The Taming of the Shrew*). The author: William Shakespeare. The composer: Giuseppe Verdi. The leading man: Placido Domingo. So, potential coming out the wazoo, right? And it didn't (mostly) disappoint. What didn't disappoint? The 1986 film by Zeffirelli of Verdi's opera of Shakespeare's play starring Placido Domingo, **Otello**.

Starring Placido Domingo as Othello, Katia Ricciarelli as Desdemona, Justino Diaz as Iago, Petra Malakova as Emilia, Urbano Barberini as Cassio (but voiced by Ezio Di Cesare), Massimo Foschi as Lodovico (voiced by John Macurdy), Edwin Francis as Montano (voiced by Edward Toumajian), Sergio Nicolai as Roderigo (voiced by Constantin Zaharia), Remo Remotti as Brabantio (voiced by Giannicola Pigliucci), and Antonio Pierfederici as the Doge, this is, as with other films of the same name, the classic story of the green-eyed monster, jealousy, manipulated by a false friend for his own ends. It begins later in the story than the usual productions of this play, starting as it does in Cyprus, after Othello and Desdemona's marriage. All that is usually in the first act of the play of Othello and Desdemona's relationship is shown through the use of flashbacks. It being one of Shakespeare's tragedies, nearly everyone dies in the end. And, of course, in this version, everyone sings everything. In Italian. (Fortunately, the DVD offers subtitles in three different languages.)

Good points: Great music. The costuming (mostly). (As one would expect, when the costumes were by one firm in Florence and three in Rome. The Italians are pretty good at Italian costume.) There is a decent use of flags and heraldry. The armor. Desdemona doesn't take as long to die as that other operatic heroine, Carmen. (Othello, on the other hand)

Bad points: Singing about what is, basically, predestination. (Was I predestined to have to listen to that? Was I predestined to then write about it this way?) Some of Desdemona's costuming is, umm, "suspicious". I'm not saying it isn't period; I'm just not saying that I think it is.
