Hats: Early period soft caps, whether the Norse Four-Panel, Phrygian, pillbox, Birka pointy etc. I'm looking for hats that will keep you warm outside, and look good doing it. I will accept early period hoods as well—the cutoff date is around 1300 (exception being pieces from the Greenland find). I am not looking for any form of coif, snood, or blocked

hat.

The A&S contest is Heraldic Display in Any Mode. Entries must be new or not previously entered in a contest. Examples are scrolls, tabards, table settings, clothing, jewelry, wood boxes, etc. If you aren't sure of an item, please feel free to contact an autocrat or any A&S officer. Last Winter Coronet had 17 marvelous entries and some very creative ones! As heraldry can be used in so very many ways, this is a great time to make something fun and new for yourself or perhaps even a gift. Documentation showing period examples will garner extra points, and documentation can be as simple as a picture from an illuminated manuscript or as complex as a research paper. Don't let it scare you; let it be a creative "jumping-off" point instead.

His Highness' Whim is the performance of an ORIGINAL bardic piece (song, story, or poem) which depicts battle and creatively glorifies violence.

Her Highness' Whim is for Shortbread Cookies. These will be judged upon taste, presentation, and documentation.

The Autocrats have a whim for Banners! Personal, household, baronial, principality, kingdom or other, which should also be new or never entered in a competition before.

Du'ad Bob Review

I know that some of you may be surprised to hear it, but Kenneth Branagh was not the first filmmaker to popularize Shakespeare. (As Edmund Blackadder said to William Shakespeare in an episode of *Blackadder* after mentioning the name Ken Branagh and Shakespeare replying, "Who's Ken Branagh?", "I'll tell him you said that. He'll be very hurt.") But it's true. What's more, this particular purveyor of popular Shakespeare plays did it when his nation was in the middle of a war for its very existence, and used this particular film to boost patriotic fervor and morale on the home front. And the man who did all this? Why, Sir (though he hadn't been knighted at the time of this movie) Laurence Olivier. The year was 1944, and the film was *The Chronicle History of King Henry Fift with His Battell Fought at Agincourt in France*, more often called and far better known simply as **Henry V**.

Starring Laurence Olivier in the title role, with Leslie Banks as the Chorus, Felix Aylmer as the Archbishop of Canterbury, Robert Helpmann as the Bishop of Ely, Vernon Greeves as the English herald, Gerald Case as the Earl of Westmoreland, Griffith Jones as the Earl of Salisbury, Morland Graham as Sir Thomas Erpingham, Nicholas Hannen as the Duke of Exeter, Michael Warre as the Duke of Gloucester, Ralph Truman as the French herald Mountjoy, Ernest Thesiger as the Duke of Berri, Frederick Cooper as Corporate Nym, Roy Emerton as Lieutenant Bardolph, Robert Newton as Ancient Pistol, Freda Jackson as Mistress Quickly, George Cole as the boy, George Robey as Sir John Falstaff, Harcourt Williams as King Charles VI of France, Leo Genn as the Constable of France, Francis Lister as the Duke of Orleans, Max Adrian as the Dauphin, Esmond Knight as Fluellen, Renée Asherson as Princess Katherine, and Janet Burnell as Queen Isabel of France, you should already be familiar with the plot of this movie, wherein Henry V of England presses his claim to the throne of France with an army, and soundly defeats the French at Agincourt.

Good points: It's Shakespeare. It's Olivier. The armor. Much of the costuming. The use of heraldry, and heralds. The French princess learning English. The tents. The Dauphin and French Constable bragging among themselves the night before the battle. The great panoply at the opening of the battle. Beginning the play as a play at the Globe

Theater and then moving it out into the real world is an interesting approach.

Bad points: Making the Bishop of Ely a laughingstock during the discussion of Salic law. Some of the heraldry was not, as we say down here, quite "right". (As in, "That boy ain't right." In this case, "That heraldry ain't right.") Fabric chainmail. (Admittedly, there was a war on, with things like metal being in short supply so as to equip the army, navy, and air forces.) The huge label on a French prince's surcoat. Winching a knight into his saddle. Armorial shields not matching the surcoats and horse barding of their bearers. The wedding cloaks. The perspective on a number of the painted backdrops made them look less real. (Although many of these were actually borrowed from the Very Rich Hours of the Duke of Berry.)

Zero breasts. 1/4 gallon of blood. 53 dead bodies. Sword fu. Cannon fu. Arrow fu. Mace fu. Leek fu. Papers with lineages roll. Knights roll. Gratuitous long slow pan of Elizabethan London. Gratuitous rainstorm. Gratuitous fainting. Gratuitous praising of horses. Academy Award nomination to Laurence Olivier as the director for making Shakespeare, and Henry V, come to life, and especially for doing so at a very trying time in Britain's history. (Indeed, the filming of one battle scene was stopped while overhead a group of RAF fighters attacked a formation of German bombers. When the air battle passed out of sight, filming continued.) A 53 on the Vomit Meter. 3-1/2 stars. Da'ud Bob says, "Check it out!"
