I would like to express my profound gratitude to the good people of Winter's Gate for their unparalleled hospitality: Their Exalted Excellencies Braun and Cempestrae; Khevron and Merewyn for opening their home to a visitor; Margery and Griffin, likewise as native guides, hosts, pliers of sake and hunters of the elusive aurora; Elena and her event staff; Ellisif and her dedicated feast crew; and all those welcoming smiles on faces too numerous to count.

What a feast! The Emperor himself could not have found fault with the bounty spread before us. Delicately vinegared cucumber, a classic miso soup, salmon in ginger and sake accompanied by onigiri (rice balls) comprised the first tray. The country is staggeringly beautiful, even clad in the sombre tones of permafrost autumn, and the people are unforgettable.

I left a piece of my heart on a darkened hillside beneath a rising moon, and in places. I will go back. I must.

Du'ad Bob Review

Once again, good ol' PBS (the Public Broadcasting Service) has come through! I mean, they almost always put out a quality product, but this time they really outdid themselves. I'd come into a little bit of money, and not having any real necessities which required immediate attention, I went on-line to see what good stuff I could find to buy with it. It didn't take long. (It never does! The trouble with having only a little bit of extra cash is that there are so very many places to spend it. I'm sure that if I were a multi-millionaire, this wouldn't be a problem. Anybody want to give me the money to check out this hypothesis? No? I didn't think so, darn it.) Anyway, in looking around to find someplace to blow these few bucks before they burned a hole completely through my pocket, I found a recent (2009) BBC/PBS production starring one of the 20th Century's greatest Shakespearean actors. Which worked out really well, since the DVD was of one of Shakespeare's plays. So it was a perfect fit. And, of course, I had to buy it. (I did mention that the money was burning a hole in my pocket, didn't I?) And so it is that this month, Da'ud Bob reviews for you the Royal Shakespeare Company's production of Shakespeare's tragedy, **King Lear**.

Starring Ian (Gandalf, Magneto, and *Richard III*) McKellen in the title role, with Frances Barber as Goneril, Monica Dolan as Regan, Romola Garai (who did such a great job in the miniseries *Emma*) as Cordelia, Ben Meyjes as Edgar/Poor Tom, Philip Winchester as Edmund, Sylvester (Dr. Who) McCoy as the Fool, Jonathan Hyde as the Earl of Kent, William Gaunt as the Earl of Gloucester, Guy Williams as the Duke of Cornwall, and Julian Harries as the Duke of Albany, this is the tale of an old man who mistakes what people say for truth, and loses everything. No, really. Old King Lear is determined to step down from the throne in all but name, dividing his kingdom between his three daughters. But before doing so, he asks them which of them loves him best. (For the record, this is never a good idea; no good can ever come from it.) He ends up banishing his youngest daughter, and dividing his kingdom between his eldest two daughters (and their husbands), and they soon set out to strip him of any remaining powers. There are some subplots, too, about a bastard son attempting to usurp the place of the legitimate son, while obtaining the affections of both of the Lear's older daughters. It's one of Shakespeare's tragedies so, of course, nearly everyone dies in the end.

Good points: It's Shakespeare! It's Ian McKellen! It's directed by Trevor Nunn! The Fool. As in many Trevor Nunn productions, the sets are somewhat minimalist, which can sometimes work well.

Bad points. As in many Trevor Nunn productions, the sets are somewhat minimalist, which can sometimes work less well. There's a fair bit of mud and gore. Many of the costumes and the overall setting seemed vaguely Russian (complete with Russian bear dancing), which felt more than a bit out of place with titles like Kent, Gloucester, Cornwall, and Albany being thrown about in the dialogue.

Zero breasts. One and a half gallons of blood. Eight dead bodies. Dowry fu. Dagger fu. Saber fu. Wine fu. Hangman's rope fu. Quarterstaff fu. Poison fu. Poor Tom rolls. (In

the mud.) Gloucester rolls. Edgar rolls. Gratuitous bear dancing. Gratuitous décolletage. Gratuitous eye gouging. Gratuitous attempted suicide. Gratuitous love triangle. Academy Award nominations to Sir Ian McKellen for not missing a step in Lear's descent into madness, and to Sylvester McCoy as the Fool for being the best fool ever in a production of this play. A 73 on the Vomit Meter. Three stars. Da'ud Bob says, "Check it out!"

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
