Fighter practices are open again at UPark Gym, but the times have changed. Due to a scheduled class, our practice is split into two times. The first is 11 am to 2:15, and the second is 4:15 to 6:15 pm. Currently, the first session will be for rapier practice (and starts around 12:30) and the later is for heavy fighters. Please keep an eye on the elist for which is first from week to week or contact the seneschal or marshal (see regnum below). If you get there for the early session and the back door is locked, go to the building's front doors, which are usually open).

All are welcome to attend fighter practices. If you're a noncombatant, you can cheer the fighters on or work on projects. Bring your own chairs if you can.

All other activities (A&S activities, guild meetings, scribal sessions, etc.) are subject to change and will be posted to the baronial email list. The above calendar includes events throughout the principality, as well as important kingdom events and wars. Those events without a listed location and in bold are local.

If you're interested in the workings of the barony, come to the monthly business meetings! Our seneschal's work schedule has been changed somewhat, and so the February meeting will be held on Wednesday, Feb. 27, starting at 5:30 pm for a short St. Boniface meeting, followed by the baronial meeting. Usually at Pizza Hut on College Road, the location may change for this meeting. Keep an eye on the elist, or contact the seneschal close to the date. (If you attend you might win an event fee waiver!)

From the Seneschal:

I am pleased to announce that Saphira the Navigator has agreed to be my deputy. My term of office expires in September and being your seneschal has been a fun experience for me.

The laws of the West Kingdom require a polling of confidence of the Baroness. The relevant portion of the law is: “Section 16.1: At least every two years, each territorial Barony will conduct a polling of confidence.” I am discussing the process with the kingdom seneschal.

There are a couple of recent policy changes that have come down from Society:

1. In January the Board of Directors (BoD) adopted a change that allows same sex consorts in coronet and crown tournaments with the approval of the Crown.

2. Another recent policy change affects the use of social media by SCA groups. These rules and guideless affect social media pages or accounts that are open to the public, but not those pages or accounts that require subscription. The Barony of Winter’s Gate Facebook page falls under these rules while the Yahoo list does not.

There are three “Core Principals of the Social Media Policy” that affect the geneal use of our Facebook page:

“c. Content placed on social media must not contain inappropriate, offensive, or confidential material and must respect principles of trademark and intellectual property.

“d. All participants engaged in using social media, from Society and branch officers to owners and administrators to the general audience shall display courteous behavior.

“e. Social media is not an approved method of distributing official information. However, groups may redistribute information already disseminated according to other applicable policies.”

There are other aspects of the policy that affect the actual administration of the pages, and those will be covered in the next business meeting.

Speaking of which, the next business meeting will be Feb. 27 from 6-8 pm, the location of which will be announced on the Yahoo list.

At Their final court before Investiture, Rurik Varyag and Trava awarded Cempestra O'Breoniann with a Snowy Owl. And now for something entirely different:

Du'ad Bob Review

Did you ever to go watch a movie just knowing that it was going to be good? Even though you didn't know just how good it was going to be? Well, that's what anticipating watching the movie for this month's review was like. I knew it was going to be good. I just didn't know how very good it was going to be. I mean, first off, it's Shakespeare. Good, right? Second, it was a production by the Royal Shakespeare Company. Also good, right? The director was Trevor Nunn, he of the minimalist sets and great camera framing, who has done a number of Shakespeare productions in the past. And finally, it starred Ian McKellen, who is a great actor in anybody's book. So you know that it's going to be good, right? Really good. But ... wow! I really wasn't quite prepared for just how good it was going to be. And I'd seen – and reviewed – productions of this play starring such luminaries as Laurence Olivier and Orson Welles. But so it is that this month, Da'ud Bob reviews for you what may be the very best production to date of Shakespeare's ***Othello***.

Starring Willard White in the title role, with Ian McKellen as Iago, Imogen Stubbs as Desdemona, Sean Baker as Cassio, Michael Grandage as Roderigo, Zoë Wanamaker as Emilia, Clive Swift (perhaps better known to many of you as Hyacinth Bucket's ["That's Boo-kay"] long-suffering husband, Richard) in a dual role as Brabantio and later in Cyprus as Gratiano, John Burgess in a dual role as the Duke of Venice and later as Lodovico, Philip Sully as Montano, and Marsha A. Hunt as Bianca, this production is basically a filmed version of a stage play. As a consequence, the sets and the action are limited, so it does not have the sweep of the Orson Welles or Kenneth Branagh productions of the same play, but what it lacks in scope it more than makes up for (1) in being a more complete version (at nearly 3½ hours!) of the play than heretofore done, allowing you to see in greater detail and with more understanding some of the

motivations of the characters, and (2) in the acting. This is, without a doubt, probably the very best production of *Othello* I have seen. It is set rather vaguely sometime in the mid-1800's (as close as I could tell from the costuming), but nothing in the play was relying on that setting; it could have been any time.

Good points: It's all Shakespeare's words. Othello has a great voice! (When Othello first appeared, somewhat in shadows, he sounded a lot like Michael Dorn, *Star Trek's* Worf.) Iago as jester and poet, a side of him not seen in most other productions. The soldiers getting drunk scene. Othello's boots. Othello's kaftan. Comparing men to stomachs.

Bad points: If I heard the words "honest" and "Iago" used in the same sentence one more time, I would probably have snapped. ("Methinks the lady doth protest too much." It was used so often that you couldn't help but disbelieve it.) At times, the action seemed a little slow.

Zero breasts. 1/4 gallon of blood. Four dead bodies. Sword fu. Dagger fu. Purloined handkerchief fu. Rodrigo rolls. Iago rolls. Desdemona rolls. Lightning flashes. Thunder booms. Gratuitous temper tantrum (literally lying on the floor and kicking). Gratuitous spiking the wine. Gratuitous "puddled spirit." Academy Award nominations to Willard White for being one of the best Othello's ever; to Ian McKellen for showing us a side of Iago that most other productions have not; to Imogen Stubbs for creating one of the most understandable and appealing of Desdemona's; and to Zoë Wanamaker for being perhaps the best Emilia yet. A 54 on the Vomit Meter. 3-1/2 Stars. Da'ud Bob says, "Check it out!"
