All other activities (A&S activities, guild meetings, scribal sessions, etc.) are subject to change and will be posted to the baronial email list. The above calendar includes events throughout the principality, as well as important kingdom events and wars. Those events without a listed location and in bold are local.

If you're interested in the workings of the barony, come to the monthly business meetings! They are now held at fighter practice. Keep an eye on Facebook, the elist, or contact the seneschal for the exact date.

From the Baron and Baroness:

Greetings Unto the Populace!

Coronet was a wonderful opportunity to share with our fair Cousins to the South, mingle with friends and family, and witness the winning of the Coronet by Prince Kenric and Princess Dagmar. Long live the Prince and Princess!

As summer winds down and we launch into fall, we have witnessed some leaves turning yellow, which the Baron assures the Populace is an effect of the rain. Changes are in the wind.

Winter's Gate will host a Captaincy Camping Event, Friday Sept. 2 through Sunday Sept. 4th. Rapier will be fighting for the Commander of the Cavaliers and Heavy Combatants will be fighting for the Captain of the Guard. Some changes will come into effect at the conclusion of the tournaments. Our Commander of the Cavaliers will hold his or her position for a full year and the next Commander tournament will be in the Fall of 2017. The Captain of the Guard will hold his or her position until Spring Captaincy, at which time the next Captain will be chosen, and will serve for a year, until Spring 2017. These changes will allow both the Commander and Captain the opportunity to complete fighting and training goals and provide each to center on specific fighting skills that are inherent to each fighter, therefore enriching Our Fighters. These changes begin the annual cycles of Captaincy tourney in the spring and Commander in the fall.

Michaelmass, which has been transformed into a two-day event, Oct. 15-16, will also herald a few changes. The Feast, a three-course sit-down feast, and Festivities including dancing (some of the dances will be taught at Captaincy) and music, will commence on Saturday, Oct. 15 with an immersion into the Medieval and Renaissance Venetian Culture.

On Sunday, Oct. 16, classes regarding Venetian Culture will be held that span cultural influences between clothing and Rapier Fighting, including a class taught by Baroness Etàin. At the end of the weekend, participants will have experienced as much Venetian Culture as possible within a two-day span.

This past week, we had the fortune to host Mistress Saige of the Kingdom of Artemesia who taught a class on Passame trim braiding. Her patience was great and the newly-acquired skill may possibly be a Baroness' whim at Yule. As announced at the business meeting, we have a tentative possibility of hosting Duke Sean from the Kingdom of Artemesia, who may be gracing us with new fighting techniques and other skills in November. Stay tuned for updates on His arrival!

Our Yule, Dec. 17th, celebration will be graced by Her Majesty Queen Eilis. During the festivities, Baron Braun and Baroness Cemper will be renewing their 20-year wedding vows. All are invited to participate.

Change is sometimes difficult but can be a welcome and fun time to experience new and exciting things! However, the unique people in our Populace is still the focus of the Barony. The current growth of our Fighting Force has been very welcome and we have new Heavy and Rapier Fighters, and our Archery Group is currently striving to establish Combat Archery. Chicken Wars V
Barony of Selviergard
August 19-21

Beware the Red Scarfed Bandit, "You killed my chicken, prepare to scramble." Set your calendars, and plan to load up your wagons and trek to the fair lands of Selviergard for a weekend of fighting fun and frivolity all wrapped around a crazy chicken!

Come for an 'eggciting' weekend all wrapped up in the Musketeer era. Bring your banners to add color and ambiance to this the Fifth Chicken War celebration.

Activities: we will scramble on the fields both Heavy and Fence, for the Cracked Egg tourney and the Red Bandit Melee; Spear the Chicken for both children and adults; Egg Toss for adults and children; Capture the Egg (balloon stomp), adults and children.

Contests: Late Period (musketeer style) garb, research a plus; Red Bandit Eye Mask; Red Bandit Egg tale, story or song; Egg dish; 'Egg' in Any Mode (other than food). There will also be an A&S table for craftsmen to display projects they are working on or have completed.

Site is the Lake Lucille Soccer Fields and group campground. Tentatively the site opens at 5 pm on Friday and closes at 6 pm on Sunday. It is suggested to your own drinking water as there is limited potable water on site.

Dogs are allowed, but must be on a leash or under control at all times and owners are responsible for clean up and disposal of waste. Everyone is responsible for taking care of and hauling out their own trash.

Only period canvas pavillions will be allowed on the soccer fields. Modern tents must camp in the group camping area for an additional \$10 per night. This fee is separate from event fee and is the campers' own responsibility to settle directly with the campground.

The site is very discreetly wet. *No* visible containers, and *absolutely no underage drinking!!! Zero tolerance on this issue.*

Event fees: adult member, \$15; adult non-member, \$20; children 5-15 years, \$5, children under 5 years, free; family cap, \$55.

There are RV hookups available, although there may be fees in addition to event fees that will be paid directly to the site owner. Potable water is available. There are flushies and showers available in a bathhouse in addition to portables located around the site. There is a covered pavillion with picnic benches and a fireplace. It is recommended you bring sunshades to set up near the eric. There is a children's playground located near the bathhouse and covered pavillion.

There is a nearby inn with limited rooms charging resort prices for offsite lodging. The site is approximately 80 miles from Fairbanks, so please plan ahead and bring all needed food, ice, adult beverages, toiletries, etc. There is a small gas station and convenience store in Nenana, approximately 30 miles away.

A&S Principality Championship

Greeting's Oertha!

First, it my absolute honor to recognize our first Principality Arts and Sciences Champion, Lord Camshron mac Gille Finnan! He entered all but one contest and produced a wide range of excellent entries. And all from Kotzebue! Please join me in recognizing Lord Camshron's accomplishment!

Second, it's a new year and time for a new championship! The schedule for the 2016/2017 tournament is below. The last two dates will be finalized when they have been added to the Kingdom calendar. If you have any questions about the schedule or how to enter, please don't hesitate to contact me!

Sept 3, 2016 – Fall Captaincy, Winter's Gate – Illumination (Studio Art),
Oct. 22, 2016 – Samhain, Eskalya – Syrups (Domestic Arts and Sciences),
Dec. 3, 2016 – Yule, Selviergard – A small item of clothing (e.g. a coif, braies, a hood, etc.) (Textile),

Jan. 21, 2017– Winter Coronet, Oertha – A Story of a Hero, Saint, or God (Performing Arts),

March 2017 – March Madness, Eskalya – Open Topic (Research Paper),
May 2017 – Spring Captaincy, Winter's Gate – Bone, Antler, or Wooden Combs (Technological).

The contests are being drawn from six categories (one contest representing

each category): Textile - Clothing, weaving, needlework, etc; Domestic Arts and Sciences - Small items, cooking, herbcraft, brewing, etc; Technological - Armor, casting, metal working, skeletal materials, etc; Studio Arts - Bookbinding, glass work, calligraphy, illumination, paper making, etc; Performing Arts - Arts which are performed; and Research – Research papers and presentations.

Individuals who wish to enter an item but will not be able to make the event, may mail items to Claire Knudsen-Latta, 917 W. 75th Ave, Apt. 2, Anchorage, AK 99518. Please email me at clairemargery@gmail.com to let me know items are coming. Items will be returned by mail with judging sheets within one week of the event.

Contestants for the championship must enter at least four of the categories. Contestants may enter only one item per event (no double dipping). Incomplete projects may be entered, so long as the part of the project being judged is complete. For example, if you want to enter a scroll in the calligraphy contest but the illumination isn't complete, you may enter it so long as the calligraphy is complete.

At least minimal documentation is required. Minimal documentation will be considered one 3x5 card and one primary source. More documentation is suggested. Research papers should be between 1,500 and 2,500 words, or four to six pages, double spaced. Papers should be submitted by email one week before the event, to allow judges sufficient time to review the paper.

If there are three or more entrants in a competition, the winner is the entry with the highest score. If there are fewer than three entries, the winner is the entry with the highest score over 66 percent of the available points. If there is only one entry, the entry will be judged, but there will be no competition – however, the points will count towards the Championship. Whoever racks up the most total points wins!

And now for something entirely different:

Du'ad Bob Review

I hadn't recalled seeing this month's flick in the theaters, and you'd think that I would have, since it was released fairly recently, in May 2015. Of course, that release was in Great Britain, and my suspicion is that it never made it to the theaters here in the U.S., or as I prefer to think of it, Greater Lonestarorra. Checking its release dates on IMDb, it was released only in Serbia, Kuwait, the Philippines, and Japan before hitting the DVD market. So I hadn't missed it here, which was a relief to me, since I try to keep track of this sort of movie when they hit the theaters, and I was afraid that I might becoming senile or something. (Hey, it's a possibility! You watch some of the movies I've had to over the years and you can start losing brain cells from it.) Anyway, we'd found it on our new best friend, Netflix, and queued it up. Well, we had to, you know. The picture for the film had a guy in some kind of leather armor holding a sword, which meant that it was almost certainly a film I needed to check out for you. And so it is that this month, Da'ud Bob reviews 2015's almost-straight-to-video action movie set in newly-Norman England, **Sword of Vengeance**.

Starring Stanley Weber as Shadow Walker (yeah, there's a good "Norman" name for you!), Peter Chaffey as Lucan, Gianni Giardinelli as Artus, Milica Jevtic

as Udela, Dave Legeno as Osgar, Kristina Jovanovic as Kwen, Edward Akroust as Romain, Misa Beric as Marin, Karel Roden as Durant, and Ed Skrein as Treden, the basic plot - if it can be called that - is that of any and all of the old Clint Eastwood "Man With No Name" spaghetti westerns, only this time set in what is supposed to be newly-conquered Norman England. The blurb for it on Netflix gave the synopsis as: "Freed from slavery, a Norman prince returns home to lead a group of exiled farmers in battle against their shared enemy - his father's murderer." Except that that's not really it, either. Why not? Well, first of all, he wasn't a Norman "prince," since there was not such thing then; he was the son of a Norman lord. He wasn't leading a group of exiled farmers; he aided some of the Saxons in order to use them in his quest to avenge his father's death by killing his uncle, who had murdered his father and sold him into slavery. And some of the settings were entirely incorrect for early Norman England; those huge stone castles didn't begin to show up until the reign of Edward I, nearly 200 years after the Conquest of 1066. But who am I to quibble about such things?

Good points: The Norman nasal helms. The Norman kite shields. Some of the chain mail was real.

Bad points: The Saxon round shields were too small. The sound effects. The soundtrack music, which went from "weird" to "annoying" to "okay, now it's just distracting it's so out of place." Shadow Walker's haircut, complete with cornrows and topknot. Most of the armor, both "Norman" and "Saxon." The costumes. The five-foot-long ladle. The "Saxon" face masks.
